

Childhood Vaccine Availability Table
-- Effective July 1, 2009 --

Eligibility Categories:

- **All Children:** Vaccine provided by MDPH for identified cohorts regardless of insurance status.
- **VFC Only:** Vaccine provided by MDPH for children *under 19 years of age* in the identified cohorts who are enrolled in Medicaid, uninsured, American Indian or Alaska Native, and those who are underinsured and seen at a federally qualified community health center.
(Please note that vaccines available for VFC eligible groups only appear shaded in the table.)

DT	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children 2 months - 6 years of age for whom pertussis vaccine is contraindicated
DTaP	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children 2 months - 6 years of age
DTaP-HepB-IPV (Pediarix®)	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children 6 weeks - 6 years of age for the primary series of DTaP, Hep B and IPV • Not approved for use as the 4th or 5th dose of the DTaP series or the 4th dose of the IPV series.
DTaP-IPV-Hib (Pentacel®)	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children 6 weeks - 4 years of age for routine immunization with the first 4 doses of DTaP, IPV and Hib at 2, 4, 6 and 15-18 months of age.
Hep A	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children 12 - 23 months of age • High-risk children* 2 - 18 years of age • Not available for routine catch-up vaccination of children ≥ 2 years of age.
Hep B	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children through 18 years of age
Hib	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children 2 - 59 months of age • Children > 5 years of age in an ACIP-recommended group*
HPV	VFC Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Routine vaccination of VFC-eligible girls at 11 - 12 years of age • Catch-up vaccination of VFC-eligible girls 13 - 18 years of age
Influenza	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children 6 months through 18 years of age
MCV4 (Meningococcal Conjugate) (MDPH does not provide meningococcal polysaccharide vaccine)	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adolescents at 7th grade entry (11- 12 years of age) • Other children and adolescents at high risk for meningococcal disease due to medical conditions, travel or occupational risk
	VFC Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Available for catch-up only for VFC-eligible 13 - 18 year olds • Not available for non-VFC-eligible children at high school entry or freshmen living in dormitories, or for routine catch-up of non-VFC-eligible children.
MMR	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All children 12 months-18 years of age

MMR-V	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children in the 2 age cohorts listed below, when both varicella and MMR are indicated: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1st dose at 12 - 15 months of age 2nd dose at kindergarten entry (4 - 6 years of age) MMR-V is not available for children who have already received 2 doses of MMR vaccine. Single antigen varicella vaccine should be used for this group.
PCV7 (Pneumococcal Conjugate)	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All children 2 - 23 months of age Children 24 - 59 months of age in an ACIP recommended group*
PPV23 (Pneumococcal Polysaccharide)	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children \geq 2 years of age who are in an ACIP recommended group*
Polio	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All children 2 months - 18 years of age
Rotavirus	NEW VFC Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All VFC-eligible infants 6 weeks to 8 months (0 days) of age (Effective July 1, 2009)
Td	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children 7 - 18 years of age
Tdap	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Adolescents at 7th grade entry (11 - 12 years of age) Children 10 - 18 years of age who have been exposed to pertussis or in an outbreak setting
	VFC Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Available for catch-up only of 13 - 18 year olds who are VFC-eligible Not available for routine catch-up of non-VFC-eligible children
Varicella	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children in the 3 age cohorts listed below <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1st dose at 12 - 15 months of age 2nd dose for : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Kindergarten entry (4 - 6 years of age) 7th grade entry (11 - 12 years of age), if not yet received 2nd dose Children 1 - 18 years of age who are exposed to varicella or for outbreak control, if they have not yet received 2nd dose Household contacts of immunocompromised individuals, regardless of age
	VFC Only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Available for catch-up only for VFC-eligible children Not available for routine catch-up of non-VFC-eligible children
